| 1. Preparation | Trip hazards, exposure to sun | 2M | Conduct a site assessment to identify and conove any trip hazards such as debris, tools, or uneven surfaces prior to commencing work. Clearly mark and barricade the work area to prove accidental entry, reducing the risk of tripping. Ensure that all pathways are slear and well-organised to facilities as afe movement around the worksite. Use appropriate footwear with con-slip soles to record to elikelihood of slipping on wet or uneven surfaces. Provide appropriate PPE to luding cont-visibility clothing, wide-brimmed hats, and UV-rated sunglasses to protect against sun exposure. Schools work crist cooler parts of the day where possible to minimise prolonged sun exposure. Imply the regular teaks in shaded or cool areas to prevent heat stress and dehydration. Supply workeds with conscreen of at least SPF 30 and enforce its frequent reapplication throughout the day. Solop protable wrade structures or utilise nearby natural shaded areas for rest periods. Educate obsers on recognising symptoms of heat-related illnesses such as heat exhaustion and heat toke and ensure immediate access to first aid. | 1L |

Setup Safety Equipment | Falling from height, equipment failure | ЗН | Conduct a risk assessment prior to starting work to identify all potential hazards and necessary controls specific to the site. Ensure all workers are trained in height safety procedures and have the appropriate certification. Use certified fall protection systems including harnesses, lanyards, and anchor points that comply with Australian Standards. Install guardrails or temporary edge protection where possible to prevent falls from the roof perimeter. Set up safety nets or catch platforms beneath the roof area where work will be conducted. Conduct regular inspections of all safety equipment before use to ensure there are no defects or damage. Implement a permit system for working at heights with a clear communication protocol among team members. Establish a clearly defined exclusion zone around the work area to keep unauthorized personnel out. Use non-slip footwear and ensure the roof surface is free from debris and any substances that could cause slips. Secure ladders properly in accordance with safe usage guidelines, ensuring they extend at least one metre above the landing point. Position all tools and materials securely on the roof or use tool lanyards to prevent them from falling. | 2M |



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SAFE WORK IN THE STATEMENT MONITORING AND REVIEW

The SWMS must be reviewed regularly to make sure it remains a fective of must be reviewed (and revised if necessary) if relevant control measures are revised. The view process should be carried out in consultation with workers (including contractors of the SWMS and their health and safety representatives who represented that work group at the workplace.

When the SWMS has been revised the PCBU mast ensure that advised that a revision has been made and how they can access the revised SWMS, including all persons who will need to change a work procedure or system as a rest of the review are advised of the changes in a way that will enable them to implement their duties and the involved in the work must be provided with the relevant information and instruction that will assist them to understand and implement the revised SWMS.

The SWMS must be monitored regularly for the effectiveness of ensuring hazard controls are effective in reducing the risk of incidents, keeping the workplace safe for all personnel. The person responsible for monitoring the effectiveness of the Safe Work Method Statement should employ a multi-faceted approach which includes but is not limited to:
