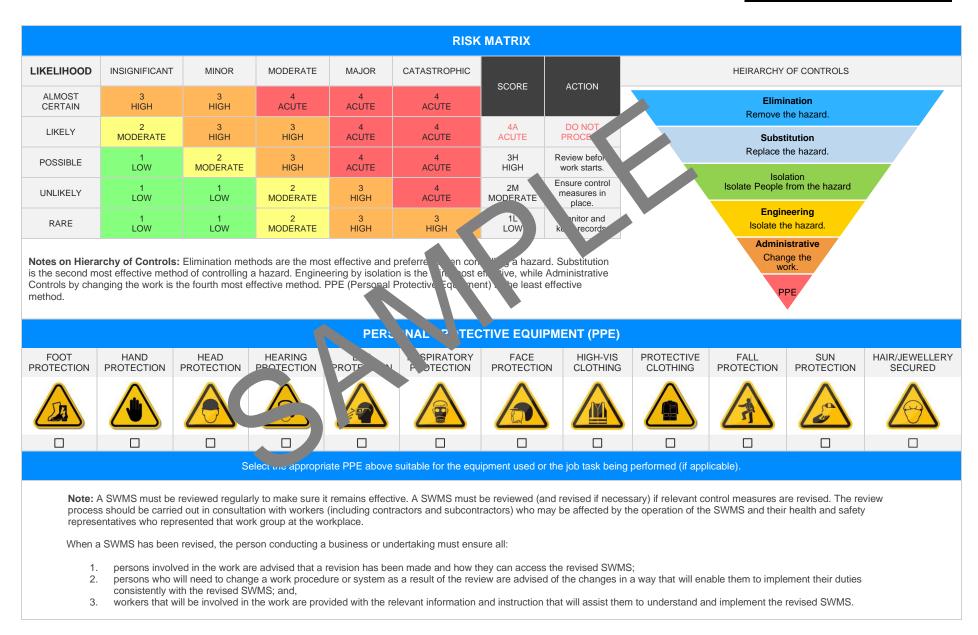

Regularly inspect electrical cords and plugs for signs of damage or wear and tear, and replace immediately if any damage is noticeable. Ensure equipment is appropriately grounded to prevent electric shock due to faulty wiring or failure of electrical insulation. Follow manufacturer's instructions while setting up the sandblasting equipment to ensure it is assembled correctly and safely. Use protective earmuffs or earplugs to minimise exposure to excessive noise. Regular breaks should also be taken to give ears a rest from the noise. Maintain a safe distance from the blasting area while the sandblasting equipment is being used to avoid exposure to flying particles and dust. Implement a lock out/tag out procedure when performing maintenance on equipment to ensure that equipment cannot be accidentally turned on. The person responsible for monitoring the effectiveness of the Safe Work Method Statement should employ a multi-faceted approach which includes but is not limited to:

- 2. Consultation with workers, contractors and sub-contractors.
- 3. Internal audits on a continual basis.
